In the morning Catedral y Giralda

The Catedral de Santa María de la Sede is the largest Gothic church in the world and the third largest church after St Peter's in the Vatican and St Paul's in London. Built on the site of the main Almohad mosque, work began in the fifteenth century. Remains of the old mosque are still preserved including the Giralda, its minaret, which is the symbol of the city.



It is a group of palaces built in different historical eras whose origins date back to the tenth century. King Pedro I of Castile played a fundamental role in its history by ordering the construction of the Mudéjar palace, the main building.



Barrio Santa Cruz

A treasure behind every corner.

The present-day districts of Santa Cruz, Santa María la Blanca and San Bartolomé make up what was once the old Jewish quarter of Seville. **Vestiges of bygone times can still be found in its narrow streets, small squares and passages.**

There is no doubt that the Callejón del Agua is a must-see street on your tour of the labyrinthine Santa Cruz quarter.

Next to the city wall, and parallel to the gardens of the Real Alcázar, this street was used to carry water from the Caños de Carmona to the Reales Alcázares. Hence its current name.



In the afternoon Museo de Baile Flamenco

In this museum situated in an eighteenth-century building visitors can learn about the origins and evolution of flamenco, its different categories and to know the main artists of Spain through the history of the flamenco.

The Church of the Saviour (Iglesia del Salvador), is the second most important church in the city after the Cathedral. It is located on the site of the ancient Roman Forum, where the largest mosque in the Caliphate era was later built in the ninth century. The present church is a seventeenth century creation in Baroque style.

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Plaza de España / Parque MªLuisa

The Plaza de España is an emblematic monument of the city, designed by the architect Aníbal Gonzalez. Made of brick and beautiful ceramic panels was made as a palace square of 50.000m2. 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Puente de Isabel II

Completed in 1852. Built in iron with a design similar to the Carrousel Bridge in Paris. It is currently the oldest iron bridge in Spain. **Before it was built, there was a floating bridge over boats from the Islamic period.**



Castillo de San Jorge

In the Castle of San Jorge, an old Almohad castle which was **the seat of the Spanish Inquisition from 1481 to 1785 and a symbol of the Inquisition in Europe**, very well preserved archaeological remains of that historical era can be seen.

Plaza del Altozano

One of the nerve centres of Triana and the entrance to the neighbourhood from the bridge. In the centre of the square stands the monument to Flamenco Art, and next to it, the bronze monument to the bullfighter Juan Belmonte, one of Seville's most famous bullfighters.

Among other things, Triana is famous for its tradition of ceramic sand pottery. **To learn about its history and evolution were commend a visit to the Triana Ceramic Centre, housed in a former ceramics factory**. In this centre, you can visit the factory as well as a permanent exhibition of ceramics made in the different artistic styles. There are also temporary exhibitions and a section dedicated to the Triana district.



Alameda de Hércules

The Alameda de Hércules is considered to be the oldest public garden in Europe, as it is an old branch of the Guadalquivir River that was drained and later converted into a peculiar and attractive urban space where leisure, culture and art meet. Nowadays it is the "Soho" of Seville, where the latest bars and restaurants and the most unique gastronomic spaces are concentrated.
