The Catedral de Santa María de la Sede is the largest Gothic church in the world and the third largest church after St Peter's in the Vatican and St Paul's in London. Built on the site of the main Almohad mosque, work began in the fifteenth century. Remains of the old mosque are still preserved including the Giralda, its minaret, which is the symbol of the city.

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Hospital de los Venerables

Nowadays this building hosts the Diego Velázquez Centre, where his works and those of his contemporaries, such as Zurbarán, Murillo and Pacheco are displayed. Founded in 1675 by Canon Don Justino de Neve, the building has two floors and consists of the church and what originally was a residence for elderly priests. It is the work of Leonardo de Figueroa and a benchmark of Sevillian Baroque architecture.



It is located on the site of the ancient Roman Forum, where the largest mosque in the Caliphate era was later built in the ninth century. Monasterio Cartuja-Centro andaluz de arte Contemporáneo - CAAC

After 1835, the building lost its religious character and was sold to the English industrialist Charles Pickman who established a pottery and porcelain factory. 

The Archaeological Museum of Seville has its origins in the late nineteenth century, when a public collection of antiquities was created, most of them extracted from the Roman city Itálica. In the twentieth century it is consolidated and expanded with the transfer from the old Convent of La Merced to its current headquarters: the Fine Arts pavilion, created by Aníbal González.






